I am Umm Sarah, the widow of martyr Abu Abdullah al-Kinani, who got martyred in al-Bab on 28 Rajab 1436 AH (28 April 2016) [the date conversion isn't correct. The correct Hijri date is 21 Rajab 1437] in al-Faruq Battalion.

Then, I got married to Abu Hamzah al-Misri, in al-Tamna'ah in Idlib, on 6 December 2016, in the presence of Abu Islam, the emir of the camp in al-Tamna'ah. He was my authorized representative, with the presence of the Shari'ah judge of the area and the witnesses.

Now, after we entered Wilayat Raqqah, I demanded to see my husband just like other sisters, but they told me that my marriage to Abu Hamzah al-Misri is void. I don't know why and no one told me. I wanted to see him to ask him for the reasons of the annulment of the marriage. They said to me that Brother Abul-Fadil [last name illegible], who works at the immigration administration, and Abu Musa al-Misri, said that I'm prohibited from meeting him, based on orders from the [illegible] authorities.

Even if we assumed that my marriage is void, and you know better than me, what is the solution then? And why has my issue not been solved quickly? We live in the Islamic State that implement God's Shari'ah, so why don't you fear God in the way you treat us? I asked to meet the Shari'ah judge, but they said it is prohibited, and all my requests related to this matter are prohibited! Brother Abul-Hasan al-Jazairi, the emir of Immigration, said that my matter should be easy to solve. However, no decision has been made yet, and we've been here for 55 days. I ask you please to look into our issue.
