As for what follows:



- The man thinks if his wife doesn't visit her family, she will ask for divorce and she will still find a way to go to her mother.

Therefore, if what the man says is true, then he can permit his wife to go, because it is necessary and this will be choosing the lesser evil. Allah knows the best and He is a better Judge.
