

Each minor listed in the roster was associated with an **adult male parent or guardian** who was listed as playing some type of role for the Islamic State and who was receiving a stipend from the group.




The time-period covered by the roster is impossible to say for sure, however, the last time the document was likely to have been updated was sometime around **December 2016**.




## **Births During Caliphate Period**
