I, [redacted], would like to inform you that I live in the house where an eviction order came to me. In the eviction order, the house was written as owned by [redacted]. My son, Hussein, does not own a house in al-Quriyah, but he has a house in Damascus and a house in Deir ez-Zour. I would also like to inform you that the house is owned by [redacted], No. 1807, Amiri al-Quriyah, who was my husband and died 15 years ago. I have been staying at home with my son Muhammad and his children for 15 years, and this house was built by my husband with his own money. Three years after his death, there was a dispute over the house, and we found that the house in the real estate records was registered in the father's name and inherited among all family members. We renewed the building permit and the house became for all the heirs. All papers, documents and the license are in your hands. It was renewed in 2005 in the name of everyone, knowing that we did not distribute our father's inheritance.

The request: I ask you to stop the eviction order, and may God reward you the best.
